ABOUT THE PHILLIPS COLLECTION

Encounter modern and contemporary art in an intimate setting at The Phillips Collection, opened to the public in 1921 in Washington's vibrant Dupont Circle neighborhood by founder Duncan Phillips. Following the death of his father and brother with whom he shared a close relationship, he and his mother responded by founding the museum, originally called the Phillips Memorial Art Gallery. "Sorrow all but overwhelmed me," he later wrote. "Then I turned to my love of painting for the will to live." Its distinctive building combines the former home of its founder (built in 1897) with distinctive new additions (built in 1960/80 and 2006). The collection continues to grow with selective new acquisitions, many by contemporary artists from around the world. Special exhibitions and frequent changes in the arrangement of the permanent collection galleries mean that there's something fresh to see on every visit to the Phillips.

Hosting an event at the Phillips is an opportunity to gain exclusive access to the intimate galleries and take an inspirational tour through an extraordinary collection of more than 5,000 works of art collected over 100 years.









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GOH ANNEX & SANT BUILDING

The Goh Annex and Sant Building hold The Gwendolyn & Morris Cafritz Gallery, the Auditorium & Sant Seminar Room, the Rothko Room, and other incredible works of art.

Floor 1

The Gwendolyn & Morris Cafritz Gallery (the Welcome Gallery) can accomodate standing receptions of up to 60 guests.

Lower Level 2

Lower Level 2 is the only event space that can be rented while the museum is open to the public. This floor encompasses two meeting areas, the Sant Seminar Room and Art Workshop, the Mansbach Auditorium, and reception space (the Community Gallery).

THE SANT SEMINAR ROOM AND ART

WORKSHOP are well-suited for all day meetings or retreats for up to **30 people each.** Spend the day at the Phillips by ordering catering to these rooms, or rent these rooms by the hour for a shorter gathering. Add on a private tour with one of our Phillips Educators for an exclusive look at the collection to enhance your group's experience, for an additional cost.

THE MANSBACH AUDITORIUM can seat up to **180 guests**. In-house A/V staffing and equipment packages can be added for an additional fee.

THE COMMUNITY GALLERY can accomodate standing receptions of up to **180 people**. This space is perfect for receptions to follow events in the Mansbach Auditorium or a day of meetings in the Sant Seminar Room or Art Workshop.

The Phillips House is perfect for an elegant dinner or reception with an old world feel. The House can accommodate a standing reception of **250 guests** and is ideal for more intimate configurations that will provide your guests with an unforgettable experience.

- Group gallery tours and workshops led by Phillips Educators can be added to your event for an additional fee, which may also include additional venue rental fees.

COLLECTION HIGHLIGHTS

The Phillips Collection has been collecting modern and contemporary art for over one hundred years. Here are a few highlights from the collection.

JACOB LAWRENCE'S MIGRATION SERIES

Through a series of 60 panels created in 1940-41, Jacob Lawrence portrays the Great Migration, the flight of over a million African Americans from the rural South to the industrial North following the outbreak of World War I. With bold and rhythmic colors and shapes Lawrence tells a story that reminds us of our shared history and at the same time invites us to reflect on the universal theme of struggle in the world today.

THE ROTHKO ROOM

The intimate Rothko Room holds four paintings by Mark Rothko, and reflects the artist's preference for exhibiting his art "in a scale of normal living." In 1960, Duncan Phillips designated a specific room for Rothko's paintings, making the Phillips the first American museum to dedicate a space to the artist's work. The space set a standard for future commissions for the artist in other locations.

PIERRE-AUGUSTE RENOIR'S LUNCHEON OF THE BOATING PARTY



Luncheon of the Boating Party (1880-81) by Pierre-Auguste Renoir remains the best known and most popular work of art at The Phillips Collection, just as Duncan Phillips imagined it would be when he bought it in 1923. The painting captures an idyllic atmosphere as Renoir's friends share food, wine, and conversation on a balcony overlooking the Seine at the Maison Fournaise restaurant in Chatou.

LAIB WAX ROOM

The Laib Wax Room, lined with fragrant beeswax and illuminated by a single bare light bulb, is the first permanently installed artwork at the Phillips since the Rothko Room. The Laib Wax Room is also the first wax room that Laib created for a specific museum. Accommodating one to two people at a time, it offers a personal, meditative encounter.

NEKISHA DURRETT'S AIRSHAFT

The Phillips Collection commissioned bold, site-specific installations by DC-based artists as part of its centennial celebrations in 2021. Nekisha Durrett's "stained glass" design made of colorful, translucent window film creates a sacred space on the two bridges of The Phillips Collection. Titled *Airshaft*, the modernist work is influenced by Jacob Lawrence's *Migration Series* and Duke Ellington's *Harlem Airshaft*.
